The omnipotence of God protects the believer's salvation. No one is stronger than the omnipotence of God, not even Satan. **John 10:28-29, "and I give eternal life to them, and they will never perish; and no one will snatch them out of My hand. My Father, who has given {them} to Me, is greater than all; and no one is able to snatch {them} out of the Father's hand."** **1 Pet 1:3-5, "Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who according to His great mercy has caused us to be born again to a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, to {obtain} an inheritance {which is} imperishable and undefiled and will not fade away, reserved in heaven for you, who are protected by the power of God through faith for a salvation ready to be revealed in the last time."**

There is no bad decision that the believer can commit that can cause them to lose his salvation...our eternal relationship. Yet, a bad decision to commit a personal sin can cause us to lose our temporal fellowship or relationship with God in time. Fellowship with God in time is important since it provides the means to live the Christian way of life and grow spiritually.
